Endeavour Intermediate School was named for one of the space shuttles, and also the ship of Captain Robert Gray, an early English explorer in the Puget Sound area. Our school building was extensively remodeled in 1993.

Endeavour Intermediate School provides rich educational programs for 2nd-5th grade students. Teachers, support staff, and parents work cooperatively to provide students with engaging learning experiences in a safe positive environment. In addition to regular classroom instruction, students attend classes with specialists such as Art, PE, Music and library.

Our comprehensive special needs program is available for students from 2nd through 5th grade. Additionally, Endeavour supports students in 2 through 7 in a self-contained Life Skills special education program. Special Education, ELL, Title I reading and LAP math is available to students who need specialized instruction.

Parents are frequent participants in our programs and contribute many hours of their time and energy to support students and teaching.
